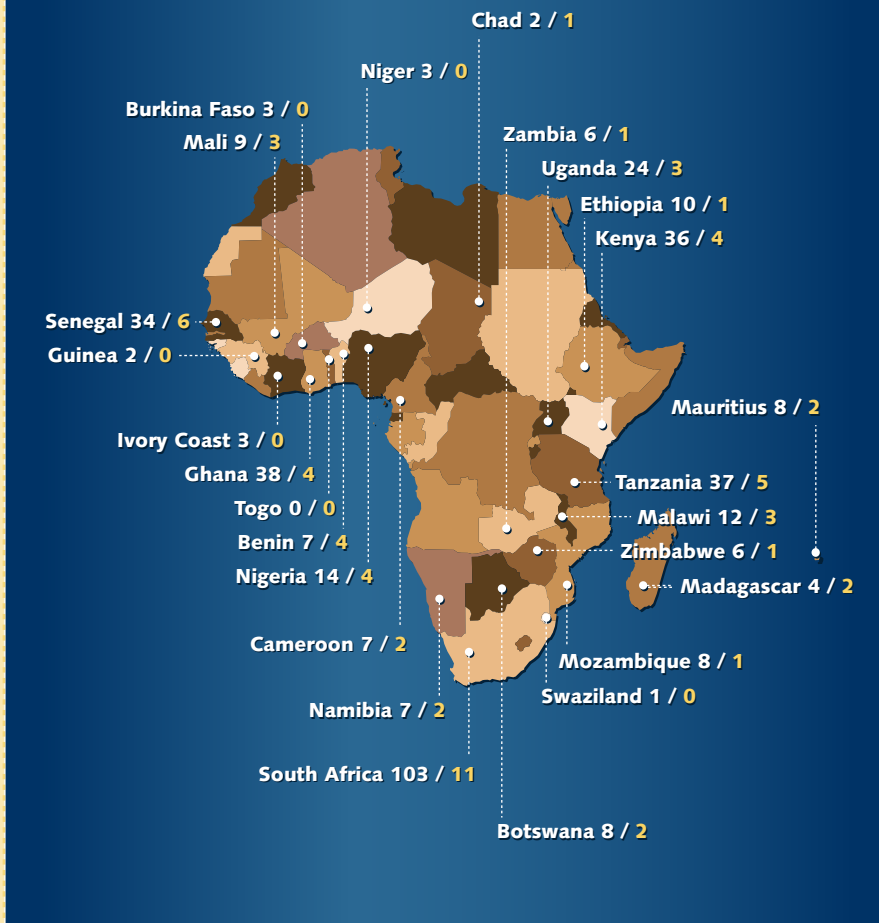

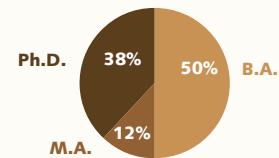

REGIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Candidates at all degree levels are accepted for all countries in the region EXCEPT:

- Burundi, Central African Republic, Guinea-Bissau, Liberia, Somalia, and Sudan (no grants are available for these countries)
- Angola, Congo-Brazzaville, Congo-Kinshasa, Eritrea, Gabon, Gambia, Lesotho, Mauritania, Rwanda, and Sierra Leone (only advanced-level graduate students may apply to these countries. Candidates interested in them should consult with IIE prior to applying.)

In the Africa regional program there are no specific award quotas for each country. Instead, the regional quota is distributed (i.e., grants are issued to individuals) based on priority order, with an eye toward as wide a geographic spread across the region as possible.
